DISCOVER THE CHINGUACOUSY TRAIL

THE CHINGUACOUSY TRAIL WAS NAMED AFTER CHINGUACOUSY PARK, THE LARGEST PARK ALONG THE TRAIL ROUTE. THE WORD "CHINGUACOUSY" MEANS "LAND OF THE TALL PINES."

The trail follows a linear park system over 9 kilometres long from James F. McCurry Victoria Park Arena in the south to Dixie-Sandalwood Park in the north. The Chinguacousy Trail passes through eight parks and provides connections to several recreation centres. Parks located along the Chinguacousy Trail include Victoria Park, Aloma Park, Knightsbridge Park, Maitland Park, Hilldale Park, Crawley Park, Manitou Park and Dixie-Sandalwood Park. The Chinguacousy Trail offers access to facilities such as swimming pools, a sports arena, tennis courts, baseball diamonds and the Brampton Soccer Centre.

The highlight of the trail is the Donald M. Gordon Chinguacousy Park, one of Brampton's largest and most impressive parks. This park offers amenities to people of all ages, such as a farm with a petting zoo, mini golf, batting cages, a greenhouse, a ski hill,

a curling club, and a skate park! The trail also provides connections to Bramalea City Centre and Civic Centre.

At the north end of the trail is the Brampton Soccer Centre, boasting outdoor soccer fields, basketball courts, a splash pad, and a cricket pitch. Inside the facility are additional soccer fields, a gymnasium, a dance studio and various other community rooms.

Chinguacousy Trail information signs are located at the Ellen Mitchell Recreation Centre, Chinguacousy Park and Victoria Park Arena. The information signs indicate the trail route, the major features and the facilities along the trail.

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**13 | Dixie Sandalwood Park/
Brampton Soccer Centre** This large park is home to the massive Brampton Soccer Centre. The facility includes basketball courts, playgrounds, a splash pad, four indoor soccer fields, a gymnasium, a dance studio, and four outdoor soccer fields.

12 | Blue Oak Park This small park is tucked away from Dixie Road and holds a soccer field and baseball diamond. This park is well connected to a long paved trail that runs west to Great Lakes Drive and east to Airport Road.



11 | Manitou Park This park connects to Bovaird Trail at its northern edge. It provides paved trails, open areas and picnicking opportunities.



10 | Ellen Mitchell Recreation Centre This recreation centre includes an indoor swimming pool and fitness area.

9 | Maitland Park North/South This well forested residential park provides plenty of paved trails for walking and cycling.



7 | Donald M. Gordon Chinguacousy Park Donald M. Gordon Chinguacousy Park is a civic landmark and a local and regional destination. The 40 hectares of park space include a greenhouse, petting zoo, skateboard park, running track, bandshell and playground as well as facilities for water play, skiing, curling, mini golf, tennis, and volleyball. There are also washrooms and a snack bar.



8 | Hilldale Park North/South This park is adjacent to schools, soccer fields, baseball diamonds, a running track, and the Terry Miller Recreation Centre Arena.

6 | Bramalea City Centre This shopping centre features over 280 stores and services.

4 | Knightsbridge Park This park features tennis, baseball and playground facilities. Nearby Knightsbridge Community and Senior Centre is located across Central Parkway.

5 | Civic Centre/Lester B. Pearson Theatre The Civic Centre is home to the Chinguacousy Branch of the Brampton Library, Brampton Transit's Bramalea Terminal and the Lester B. Pearson Theatre.

2 | Aloma Park This park runs along Etobicoke Creek and is well equipped with open areas and a playground.



3 | Crawley Park A small residential park for walking, jogging and cycling.

1 | James F. McCurry Victoria Park Arena This large park area features well-maintained soccer fields and connects to Professor's Lake Trail.
